June 19-23

Quack A Doodle Moo 8:30 am- 12:30 pm Ages 3-5	With fun on the farm and beats in the barn, campers won't want to miss this party in the pasture!
Sing It Out 8:30 am- 12:30 pm Ages 6-10	Do you like to act? Do you love to sing? Then this camp is for you! Students will learn the skills needed to bring a mini-musical to life on the stage.
Acting For Kids 1:30 pm- 5:30 pm Ages 6-10	In this camp students will learn the basic of stage acting, theatre terminology and how to build character and get over stage fright.
Acting and Improv 1:30 pm- 5:30 pm Ages 11-15	This camp focuses on the collaborative skills and exercises required in improvisation work. We will explore the art of improvisation through theatre games and techniques that teach quick thinking and build confidence. We will learn the rules of improvisation, how to tell spontaneous stories.

June 26-30

Move to The Music 8:30 am- 12:30 pm Ages 6-10	Do you shy away from musical theatre because of the dancing? Or feel uncomfortable learning a simple dance combination? This camp will strive to alleviate those fears. Simple combinations will be taught so campers are more comfortable with the process. This is a great opportunity to become more at ease with movement, improve your coordination and learn to have fun at auditions.
Monologues 8:30 am- 12:30 pm Ages 11-15	Strengthen your approach to tackling monologues. Whether for performance, auditions, or growth as an actor and speaker, this class will build up your confidence in executing monologues.
FaceTime 1:30 pm- 5:30 pm Ages 6-10	This fun camp will give students the opportunity to explore different types of face painting. Students will learn how to create characters on their face.
Medley of Musicals 1:30 pm- 5:30 pm Ages 11-15	Learn and perform musicals in a musical revue style setting. Technique such as ear and rhythm training, proper breathing while singing and dance.

July 3-7 (No camp on July 4)

Nursery Rhyme Time 8:30 am- 12:30 pm Ages 3-5	These pint size performers get a chance to light up the stage by acting out our favorite Nursey Rhymes.
Intro To Popular Musicals 8:30 am- 12:30 pm Ages 6-10	This jumping musical theatre camp will teach students songs and basic choreography from popular Broadway musicals.
After Happily Ever After 1:30 pm- 5:30 pm Ages 6-10	We all always wonder what happens after the story ends. In this camp students will have the chance to create their own ending.
The ABC's of Acting 1:30 pm- 5:30 pm Ages 11-15	This class teaches the acting essentials. Refine your auditioning skills and learn more about Monologues and presentation. This camp is a great way to boost your self confidence.

Talk Less, Smile More 1:30 pm- 5:30 pm Ages 11-15	Don't throw away your shot to be in this Hamilton themed camp. Students will have the chance to sing and dance to the hit Broadway musical, Hamilton, that is taking New York by storm.

Checks will be accepted until one week prior to the start of a camp. If the camp you are paying for starts in less than a week, payment must be in the form of cash or credit card.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- **How do I register?** You may either register online or mail or fax the enclosed registration form.
- **Is there a charge to register online?** There is a convenience fee charged by the online company.
- **Where is the camp located?** All of our camps are located at the Greensboro Cultural Center on the 4th floor with the exception of our production camps which are located at the theatre.
- **What do the students need to wear?** Students may wear comfortable clothes and shoes. No flip flops.
- **Do you need prior experience?** No prior theatre experience is necessary.
- **Is there a final performance?** On the final day of each camp we invite family and friends to come in and see what the students have worked on throughout the week.
- **What time is lunch?** We have our lunch break in between each session of camp. (12:30-1:30pm) Our instructors are with the students at this time.
- **Do you provide lunch or snack?** We do NOT provide any lunch or snack for students.
- **How soon do I need to register?** We ask that students are registered one week prior to the start of the camp.
- **Can I pay on the first day?** You may register on the day of camp with either cash or credit card. This payment must be made to either our Camp Assistant or Mrs. Roz. Teachers will not be authorized to take payment.
- **How early/late can kids arrive?** We offer early drop off (8:00am) or late pick up (6:00pm) for a small fee.
- **Is there a sibling or multi-camp discount?** Please contact Mrs. Roz for information on this.
- **How many children are in each group?** We accept 20 students in each camp with the exception of our production camps which we allow 35 students.
- **Are there background checks done on instructors?** All of our instructors are well qualified and we do background checks on all of them before they begin employment.
- **Can I make payments?** We do offer payment options for our camps. The balance must be paid in full 2 weeks prior to the start of the camp.


